Chief Spellman submitted a report to the Board to update the events happening at the Fire Department and will have a quote next meeting for the ambulance. Also, the Ladder Truck has what they believe to be an engine solenoid problem and it is being looked at.

Trustee Gleisinger gave Trustee Daugherty and Trustee Orewiler a letter of intent for interest in the position for Fire Inspector. Trustee Daugherty also

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had two people interested in the position. Trustees will go into executive session at the next meeting to discuss all potential candidates.

Trustee Gleisinger updated the Board on the productivity of the Road Department. They are going to start mowing the cemeteries and have a couple of tile issues they will be quoting.

Trustee Orewiler had an idea about concreting the parking lot, at least where everyone parks and Trustee Gleisinger would like to concrete the entrance way and have a concrete pad for the dumpster, then asphalt the remainder of the lot. The Board discussed and concluded they will get a bid for an all-asphalt parking lot with a virgin mix. Once the bids are obtained Trustee Daugherty will bring to the meeting.

Trustee Orewiler brought to the Board's attention the Mutual Aid given to Troy Township in the year 2023. Springfield Township provided 48 runs to Troy Township and only received 12 runs in return. Chief Spellman explained that they only have two people working and if they get multiple calls they don't have the staff to work both calls. Madison Township provides a lot of mutual aid for Springfield Township and Chief Spellman explained that is how mutual aid works.

Fiscal Officer Kochheiser gave the Board the March Management Reports to be approved and signed and the same were signed.

Richland County Commissioners would like to appoint Sam Sauder for the 9-1-1 Representative for Richland County. He was nominated by all the Townships at the Health Department meeting to be the Representative.

Resolution #69-2024: Trustee Gleisinger made a resolution to acknowledge the creation of the Richland County 9-1-1 Program Review Committee and the necessity for municipal corporations and townships to finalize the appointment process in accordance with ORC 128.06 (A), whereas Township Trustee Sam Sauder is interested and qualified to serve as the Township's representative, therefore the Springfield Township Board of Trustees supports the nomination of Sam Sauder to serve on the 9-1-1 Program Review Committee, seconded by Trustee Orewiler and upon a roll call vote all members voted "AYE"

April 1st, 2024 Matthew Carey made a public records request. FO Kochheiser emailed the Trustees the public records request and received a response from two of the Trustees but didn't receive anything from Trustee Daugherty. FO Kochheiser gave Trustee Daugherty the request again so that he could obtain the items requested and she could then forward them on to Matthew Carey.

FO Kochheiser reminded the Board of the Records Commission Meeting prior to the next meeting on April 16. 2024 @ 6:30pm.

<u>Public Comment:</u> Craig Hunt asked if the old millings from the parking lot could be spread out maybe at a school or used for berms instead of just being dumped. Trustee Gleisinger stated that they sometimes use recycled millings in the parks. Trustee Daugherty also mentioned that the asphalt company could provide a discount if they were to take the mills.
