Marc Pfizenmayer went over the Ohio Plan with the Board for the renewal of the policy. He obtained a quote from Hiscox for a cybersecurity policy as requested by the township. The total premium for this policy would be \$5,735. The new Ohio Plan policy was quoted at a premium of \$33,543, this includes the addition and subtraction of different equipment from last year. The new premium is \$1,259 more than the previous year.

At the last meeting, Chief Spellman discussed with the Board the monitor brackets for the new Heart Monitors. Penn Care came to the department

with the brackets, and they did fit the truck. The department does not need the bottom part of the bracket, only the top part.

Motion #156:2025: Trustee Gleisinger made a motion to purchase three monitor brackets from Penn Care at a total cost of \$2,700.00, seconded by Trustee Daugherty and upon a roll call vote all members voted "Aye".

In July, the Fire Department was awarded a 2025 EMS Grant and would like to use the grant to purchase 3 Video Laryngoscopes from Boundtree. Total is \$6,075.66, with the EMS grant being \$3,227.00 and the remainder of \$2,848.68 paid from the Fire Fund. The department tested three different devices and liked this model the best and it is rechargeable.

Motion #157-2025: Trustee Gleisinger made a motion to purchase three Video Laryngoscopes at a cost of \$6,075.66, with the EMS grant being \$3,227.00 and the remainder of \$2,848.68 paid from the Fire Fund. seconded by Trustee Daugherty and upon a roll call vote all members voted "Aye".

The department tested some rescue tools in July. Jerrod Strouth is working on a Grant from BWC for \$40,000.00. If the township were to accept the grant money, they would need to match the money with an additional \$13,000. The department would like to use the grant for battery operated rescue tools. The grant is ready to be submitted if the Board approves. Board Approved.

The Road Department completed the berming of Snodgrass and Alta West Roads. Striping for Alta West was completed as well as a tile job at 269 Rudy Road. The Road Department also mowed cemeteries in the last couple weeks.

FO Kochheiser and Trustee Gleisinger went to a meeting held by the County Commissioners on Thursday, and several people were complaining about how high the property taxes are. House Bill 96 would provide the opportunity for an increased homestead exemption. If the exemption is set at the max this would create a loss of \$88,693.57 for Springfield Township. No departments were in favor of this plan. There will be another meeting, October 23 at 11:00a.m. State Representatives will be at this meeting and Trustee Gleisinger will update the Board after the next meeting.

Trustee Gleisinger went to the Health Department for the guidelines on Septic Systems, specifically what is interpreted for replacement or repair. A new system could cost as much as \$5,000.00 if a property owner is made to upgrade to the new standards. Trustee Gleisinger received an email from Tony Vero asking the State for an interpretation.

The Health Department is having a Health Fair offering Vaccines, Vision Screenings, Mammograms, Lung Screenings, and Cancer Screenings on Oct 17th.

Trustee Daugherty has been in contact with Generac for the project at Station #2 and they are waiting on Marc Danals to move forward.

FO Kochheiser presented the Board with the September Management reports for signatures. FO Kochheiser emailed the reports to the Trustees. Board signed.

FO Kochheiser presented the Board with the new 2026 Meeting and Payroll Schedules. She will bring them back to the next meeting for approval.
