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

Present: Craig Hunt, Ted Wendling, Marc Fitzenmeyer, Josh Heller, Dustin Gray and Amanda Hike.

Guest speaker Ted Wendling from Rinehart, Walters, Danner & Associates spoke to the Board about the benefits of obtaining their company as the Agent of Record for Springfield Township insurance benefits. If they were given the opportunity, their company would become the benefits department. They would send out communications monthly to be forwarded to employees, any questions from employees could be answered quickly, and be available for group meetings anytime they are needed. Rinehart represents all insurance companies across the state and would be able to handle dental, vision, health, and cancer insurance. If Springfield Township decides to obtain Rinehart, they could change the insurance mid-year as well as agent of record anytime. Mr. Wendling will email Anita with the information needed.

Motion #17-2025: Trustee Gleisinger made a motion to change the Agent of Record for Springfield Township to Rinehart, Walters, Danner, & Associates effective February 4, 2025, seconded by Trustee Daugherty and upon a roll call vote all members voted "Aye".

Guest speaker Josh Heller from Southeastern Equipment spoke to the Board about the quote for 521G2 Stage 5 Wheel Loader for \$180,464.00. The quote is for standard options except for upgrades of Visibility Bundle and Coupler Bucket. This wheel loader can change out attachments and purchase would include maintenance check-ups for three years.

Motion #18-2025: Trustee Gleisinger made a motion to purchase the 521G2 Stage 5 Wheel Loader at state contract pricing for \$180,464.00 from Southeastern Equipment, seconded by Trustee Daugherty and upon a roll call vote all members voted "Aye".

Motion #19-2025: Trustee Gleisinger made a motion to sell our current 521D Loader for \$37,00.00 to the Richland County Highway Department/Engineer no later than May 30, 2025, seconded by Trustee Orewiler and upon a roll call vote all members voted "Aye".

The Road Department has been busy salting/plowing roads and servicing equipment.

Chief Spellman presented the Board with the Monthly Fire Department Report. Mutual aid was given on 14 calls and was received on 4 calls. There were two significant structure fires and one significant motor vehicle accident.

The firewalls at the Fire Department will need to be replaced and will cost \$1,290.90 to take the old firewall out and put the new one in. Board approved.

Chief Spellman recommended firefighter/paramedic Laura Ulmer as a candidate for a part-time fire fighter position. She has worked full-time at Crestline and Galion, gaining experience in the field and is currently going to nursing school.

Motion #20-2025: Trustee Daugherty made a motion to hire part-time FF/Medic Laura Ulmer effective February 22, 2025, with a one-year probationary period, provided she passes her agility test, seconded by Trustee Gleisinger, motion carried.

FFII/Medic Tristan Pasco currently works full-time for Galion and was recommended by Chief Spellman as a candidate for a part-time position.

Motion #21-2025: Trustee Orewiler made a motion to hire part-time FFII/Medic Tristan Pasco effective February 22, 2025, with a one-year probationary period, provided he passes his agility test, seconded by Trustee Gleisinger, motion carried.

Trustee Orewiler updated the Board on the Safety Drug Program. This program could handle random drug testing and if classes are attended a discount would be offered. Additional grants are available through the BWC.

Business Accounts through Amazon are now free to Townships and since the Township is currently paying for the account a refund could be requested.

Trustee Orewiler updated the Board on a bill in the house that if passed Township owned vehicles will state the Township rather than the county.

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The Board approved the Township to return to Columbia Gas as the natural gas provider for the Fire Dept., removing Kratos for now until rates can be further investigated. The rates with Trebel are currently too high and the Board will not renew the contract with the current rates.


