Motion #163-19: Mr. Orewiler made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Mr. Gleisinger and upon a roll call vote all members voted "AYE".

Chief Carey had a few questions for the Board regarding the Ohio Plan insurance policy.

Chief Carey presented some changes to the clothing allowance for the Board to review.

The Board approved payment of an invoice from My Pro Apparel in the amount of \$1,602.40 for uniform t-shirts. This approval is over the allowed limit but the Board is allowing it this time since they were 4 separate purchases combined into one invoice.

Motion #164-19: Mr. Currens made a motion to increase the purchase limit from \$500 to \$1,000 for both the fire department and road department without previous Board approval, seconded by Mr. Gleisinger and upon a roll call vote all members voted "AYE".

Chief Carey presented some information to the Board regarding Inspection Bureau purchases for future events and fire prevention and discussed possible line item in the future.

Motion #165-19: Mr. Orewiler moved to approve Chief Carey have \$3,000 until the end of the year for fire prevention items, seconded by Mr. Gleisinger and upon a roll call vote all members voted "AYE".

Chief Carey updated the Board on the 2013 Sutphen engine. He will be going to West Virginia this week to look at it. The Broker with the engine is also interested in the tanker.

Mr. Orewiler updated the Board on the rental property. It is in contract.

The concrete pads at the road department and behind St#1 will be done in about 3 weeks.

The 2019-2020 salt price will be \$101.34 per ton through the Richland County Engineer with Cargill, Inc., however, Trustee Gleisinger is looking for other options to purchase salt.

Mr. Gleisinger and the Road Superintendent will be going to a meeting at the Richland County Soil and Water on September 12 at 6:30am.

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Mr. Gleisinger updated the Board on the Road Department. The 2019 Chip and Seal project is completed. They have also been helping Sandusky Township with some asphalt repairs.

Mr. Currens is waiting to hear from Verizon regarding the cell phone tower proposal.

Mr. Gleisinger had a few questions regarding some grants. The grant that he is asking about, the department needs a DUNS number. Chief Carey is in the process of getting the fire department one of these numbers.

Resolution #166-19: Mr. Currens moved to adopt a resolution accepting the amounts and rates as determined by the budget commission and authorizing the necessary tax levies and certifying them to the County Auditor for 2020, seconded by Mr. Orewiler, and upon a roll call vote all members voted as followed:

- Mr. Robert W. Currens AYE
- Mr. Brad E. Orewiler AYE
- Mr. Paul L. Gleisinger AYE

FO Kochheiser presented the Board with the 2020 meeting dates and payroll schedule.

The Board approved the final proof of the ballot language for the Board of Elections.

FO Kochhesier informed the Board that MedBen is asking for renewal of the townships HRA Plan for 2020. She would like to contact Lori Hager to see if she can handle all insurance contracts when an employee needs to be removed or added to the townships accounts.

The Board signed the August management reports.

The Board will no longer be able to hire David Krishbaum until they receive a completed OPERS Independent Contractor form that has been sent twice and not returned.

Chief Carey spoke with Mayor Hutchinson regarding tax abatements and updated the Board on all that was discussed.

Public Comment:

Firefighter Gast spoke with the Board about a call that the duty crew went on today and let them know how great two of the new employees did on this call.

Craig Hunt spoke his concerns regarding the tax abatement and how he had asked the councilman some questions on this matter.

Motion #167-19: There being no further business to come before the Board, Mr. Orewiler made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Mr. Currens, motion carried.

The meeting adjourned at 8:35 p.m.
