Motion #45-2026: Trustee Orewiler made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Trustee Gleisinger, motion carried.

Present: Craig Hunt, Nathan Volz, Dorinda Strang, and Jeff Strang,

Guest Speaker Dorinda Strang is part of the Richland County Citizens for Property Rights and Development and is visiting residents who did not ban Solar Farms. The couple discovered that most of the voters they have talked to don't know this issue is on the ballot in May and once explained what it was about the voters were willing to vote no to reverse what the Richland County Commissioners did in July. The couple did not agree with the restrictions and they have yard signs and literature if the township would like to represent the issue. Trustee Gleisinger informed the couple the township did not participate because we have our own resolution that is not restrictive. Jeff Strang believed that each property owner's case should be discussed according to that particular situation and not just a direct no given without any discussion. Ohio Senate Bill 52 passed in 2021 empowering the county commissioners to be able to restrict or veto proposed large scale solar and wind projects within their jurisdiction. Trustee Gleisinger explained that the Zoning Department spent a lot of time on this issue and Richland County Regional Planning has the township's Zoning Policies and Maps. The solar issue is the last ten pages if they would like to read

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it. Regional Planning helped our township create it and it took them a couple of years to do so.

Chief Spellman presented the Board with a resignation letter from part-time FF Gabriel Ivy effective April 10th. Trustee Orewiler asked how long he been with the township. Chief Spellman replied just short of a year and he is not liking the job like he thought he would.

Motion #46-2026: Trustee Orewiler made a motion to accept the resignation of part-time Firefighter Gabriel Ivy effective April 10th, seconded by Trustee Gleisinger, motion carried.

Trustee Gleisinger updated the Board on the Road Department. The department has been patching roads and working on putting a list together of damaged trees. Whatever the Road Department can't take care of they will have someone come in and do. Smetz's Tire and Service Center gave a quote for two new tires at state pricing for the mower of \$1529.09.

Motion 47-2026: Trustee Gleisinger made a motion to purchase two new Firestone Performer EVO R1W tires from Smetz's Tire & Service Center at state pricing for \$1,529.09, seconded by Trustee Orewiler, motion carried.

Trustee Gleisinger updated the Board on the generator at Station #2. The rest of the pad has been poured and metal bollards (posts that go vertical) have been installed so that no one could back up into the generator.

Trustee Gleisinger updated the Board on the damaged fire truck. The company that the fire truck was taken to for repairs did not want to tear down the truck in order to repair it so Trustee Gleisinger talked to the adjuster and Independence Fleet in Independence Ohio is willing to do the repairs. The repairs are estimated to be under the total price allowed by the insurance company for repairs so the truck is not going to be totaled. It will probably be about 2 months before it is repaired.

Trustee Gleisinger had an appointment with Jotika from Regional Planning and he spent an hour with her going over Regional Planning and how they could benefit Springfield Township. She gave Trustee Gleisinger a couple of ideas that he is working on. There is federal money available that is separate from what the county provides. Trustee Gleisinger is going to prepare an excel sheet for each road with what has been done and when it was done so that doing the budget would be easier.

Trustee Orewiler traveled Wiles Road and it needs paved. He asked the Board if this was something we were planning on doing this year. Trustee Gleisinger replied that Wiles Road will be done. There are places where mud is coming up so whoever did the road initially did not do what they were supposed to on the base and the chip and seal. Once the township gets everything repaired, we will chip and seal. After excavating we will know what needs to be done.

Trustee Orewiler informed the Board that he obtained the book on abandoned houses from Lt. Gray and Springfield Township is doing okay. Katie Shaffer's place on Flowers Road is broke up. Trustee Gleisinger responded that there was someone who wanted to buy the property but she was not willing to sell. Trustee Orewiler responded that Katie Shaffer was now deceased.

Trustee Orewiler informed everyone present that the Safety Council Meeting is April 16th and he needs someone to attend in his place. He did not know what the subject title was going to be and added that the township could not miss any more meetings.
